Ten Scholastic Publications.

1. Agbeja, A.M., Dutton G.N.: Conjunctival incisions and their relationship to the type of Bleb formation following Trabeculectomy. Eye, 1987; 1: 738-743.  
Comment – In 1987 when this study was published, the findings were totally new to Ophthalmology. It was previously believed that the type of conjunctival incisions had no relationship to the type of bleb formation following trabeculectomy. This we proved not to be the case and since then this method of surgery has been adopted as better with other studies confirming our findings following the new revelation.
2. Agbeja, A.M. Dutton, G.N.: Adie's syndrome as a cause of Amblyopia J. Paed. Ophthalmol. and Strab, 1987; 24: 176-177.  
Comment – Adie's syndrome had never been reported in the literature as causing amblyopia in children and so it was a totally new concept. The prompt treatment the authors administered, giving bifocal glasses to a 4-year-old child, had never been heard of in ophthalmology. This treatment was what saved the child from becoming blind.
3. Agbeja, A.M., Dutton, G.N. : One-Year Study of CT Scans in Patients with Visual Field Loss. African J. of Neuro Sci. 1990 : 9 : 34-36.  
Comment – Some specific visual field losses were thought to be due to some particular intracranial lesions. This was found not to be the case in this study so we redirected the thoughts of the practicing ophthalmologist to some other intracranial problems. The importance of the use of the CT scanner was highlighted in neurosurgery and neuro-ophthalmology.
4. Agbeja, A.M., Osuntokun, O : Ocular Gun Shot Injuries in Ibadan. African J. of Med & Med Sci. 1991; 20: 35- 40.  
Comment- there was an increase in gun-shot injuries in Ibadan and we wanted to find out the causes and visual outcome. Most patients had a poor visual prognosis and so educating the public about the dangers of dane guns was advocated.
5. Shokunbi, M.T., Agbeja, A.M., : Ocular Complications of Head Injury in Children. Child's Nerv. Syst, 1991 7: 147-149.  
Comment- this study highlighted the Ocular complications of head injured children which hitherto had not been highlighted in literature. It was advocated that the eyes of head injured children should be examined for treatable affectations.
6. Agbeja, A.M., : Intraocular Lens Implantation – The Nigerian Experience. African J. of Med & Med Sci. 1994; 23: 233-237.

Comments- this was the first study of it's kind in Nigeria. Although intraocular lens implantation after cataract extraction had been done in Caucasians for a few years, no where in literature was there the outcome in Africans. The paper highlighted the problems, successes and complications of intraocular lens implantation in Nigeria.

7. Agbeja A.M.: Non-retrobulbar (Subconjunctival) Anaesthesia for trabeculectomy. African J. of Med. & Med. Sci. 1995; 24; 165-167.  
Comment- this was the first time ever that this method of anaesthesia was being described for Trabeculectomy. Since then, many Ophthalmologists have been using this method of anaesthesia for Trabeculectomy in Nigeria and the United Kingdom, and other studies have confirmed its efficacy.
8. Baiyeraju-Agbeja, A.M. Oko, H.O.: Astigmatism in post operative cataract patients. Nig. J. Surg. 1994; 1: 47-50.  
Comment- the problem of astigmatism had never been addressed in post operative cataract patients in Nigeria. This was therefore a first of its kind in our setting. The causes of high astigmatism were enumerated and ways of reducing these were advocated.
9. Baiyeraju-Agbeja, A.M., Ajewole, J.F.: Advantages of Simultaneous bilateral trabeculectomy over consecutive bilateral trabeculectomy in Ibadan. Nig. Post. Med. J. 1996; 3 (3): 73-75.  
Comment- Simultaneous bilateral trabeculectomy is avoided by most ophthalmologists but in view of our peculiar problem of poverty in a lot of our patients, this method was tried and found to be quite successful. Since then, the method has been put in use in the hospital and found to relieve our patients the financial burden of paying for 2 separate operations and a longer hospital stay.
10. Agbeja- Baiyeraju A. M., Bekibele C.O., Bamgboye E.A., Omokhodion F., Oluleye T. S. The Ibadan glaucoma study. Afr. J. Med. And Med, Sci. 2003; 32(16): 371-376.  
Comment- Glaucoma is a blinding disease accounting for over 5 million blind people in the world. Over 70% of global glaucoma is found in developing countries. This was the first study in South-Nigeria detailing the prevalence of glaucoma.

My area of specialization is in Paediatric Ophthalmology and Surgical Ophthalmology. In Paediatric ophthalmology, the most recent studies focused on neonates, to screen for retinopathy of prematurity and to find out ocular problems in newborn infants needing special care. These had never been studied in the African setting and so our publications were the first of their kind in ophthalmic literature. The other publications in Paediatric ophthalmology revealed that head injured children must be ophthalmologically assessed as treatable causes of blindness were found. If properly treated, blindness could be prevented in children with penetrating eye diseases. Some rare diseases like Adie's Syndrome causing amblyopia and syndromatic hepatic ductular hyperplasia were found to be treatable ophthalmologically.

The focus of the published work in Surgical ophthalmology is a new anaesthetic procedure, which was introduced for trabeculectomy. Since then, many ophthalmologists all over the world have been using this method and other studies have confirmed its efficacy. The other publications in Surgical Ophthalmology focused on the restoration of sight by new methods like intraocular lens implantation and simultaneous bilateral trabeculectomy, which greatly improved the quality of life of our patients. This also reduced the length and cost of hospital stay, as most of our patients are indigent. These methods have also been accepted by practicing ophthalmologists in Nigeria, as they have been found to be cost effective and at no danger to the patients.
