Research Focus:

My research focus has been in three major areas in the glaucoma sub-specialty; Epidemiology, Management and Exfoliation glaucoma. The epidemiology, clinical presentation and importance of community eye outreach programs in earlier diagnoses of glaucoma has been described in our work. Some of the scholarly contributions include a landmark study that first reported that the age -adjusted prevalence of glaucoma in Nigeria was 6.9%. Managing glaucoma in resource-deprived regions of SSA is a huge challenge and surgical management has been advocated as a first line of management. Our work has been directed at reporting the outcomes of these surgeries in Nigerians and suggesting ways of improving the outcome of glaucoma surgeries. One of such innovations is the active bleb management in the postoperative management of trabeculectomy with improved outcomes. This was succinctly reported in our work where the improved efficacy of trabeculectomy with active bleb management in the short and long term was demonstrated. Another major contribution to knowledge is the surgical outcomes of membrane tube-type glaucoma drainage devices in Nigerians. Prior to this time, shunt surgeries were not possible in Nigeria. Patients whose intraocular pressure could not be controlled with trabeculectomy and medical management had to travel abroad for the glaucoma shunt surgery. Patients who need this surgery now have the opportunity of having the surgery here in Nigeria. The outcome has been reported in a paper published in January 2018. Another area of treatment is the use of lasers in glaucoma management. The efficacy of argon laser trabeculoplasty in reducing intraocular pressure in Nigerian was published in 2017. This study reported that argon laser, a relatively cheaper laser machine was also effective in lowering intraocular pressure and the result was reasonably comparable to that of selective laser machine which is far more expensive and unavailable in many clinics in Sub-Saharan Africa. The other research focus is on exfoliation glaucoma and exfoliation syndrome. As a co-investigator in the worldwide Exfoliation Glaucoma Genetics Consortium (Singapore) blood samples were collected from patients with exfoliation glaucoma/syndrome and sequencing analysis was performed on the extracted DNA. Exfoliation syndrome in Nigeria was first reported in a publication which was conducted, designed and performed by me. Lastly, scholarly contributions have been made as a coauthor to the international guidelines for glaucoma care by the International Council of Ophthalmology. Currently, I am a principal investigator in the Severity Treatment Acceptability of Glaucoma therapy in an African-wide study, and a co-investigator in studying the genetics of glaucoma in Sub-Saharan Africa.
