 - b. **Brief Summary:** As an NIHR academy member, Mary's research is focused on improving the oral health and well-being of slum dwellers. The project was a single-site extension of the multi-country survey that involved Kenya, Pakistan, Bangladesh, and Nigeria, on improving the health of people living in slums. The project was mixed methods parallel convergent in design and was approached by conducting three research works with unique objectives. A Systematic review on oral health in slum and non-slum urban settings of the Low and Middle-Income Countries (LMICs): This was because a preliminary narrative review revealed very few studies conducted globally on oral health in slums. The second was a Quantitative study. A community oral health survey on the prevalence of oral health conditions, the determinants and treatment needs among slum residents in comparison with their non-slum counterparts. This was aimed at gathering baseline information on the current oral health situation among the slum residents relative to other settings. The last study was a Qualitative research: This was an exploration of the perspectives of the slum dwellers about their dental health experience using Focus Group Discussions. This was aimed at providing information about their voices on their needs and preferences that can facilitate the planning and designing of intervention strategies as equal partners in efforts to reform oral health care. **The design of the project is an innovative approach among oral health studies in Nigeria and the Low- and Middle-Income countries.**
